New registration process for 12 STARS BCF League squad

Starting at the end of May this year, players representing 12 Stars in Belgian League matches must have fulfilled additional registration criteria.

All players will have to produce Belgian Cricket Federation ID cards for inspection by the match umpires prior to the game. The ID cards will be used to verify that all team members are part of the team's registered squad and also include some personal injury insurance.

The registration procedure is relatively straight forward. You should speak to our captain, Richard Nash (0498 757840), as soon as possible to obtain a membership form: once you have completed the necessary details (we also need a passport photo - preferably an electronic version) and you have paid the 12 Stars club membership fees, the club will order your ID card, which you should receive within a few days.

Do you want to play in the League ?

IMPORTANT: if you want to play for 12 Stars in weekend league matches, and unless you are sure Richard is aware of your interest in playing in league matches, contact him as soon as possible. League squad membership is open to all of our members - while we always try to put out our best team, you will definitely get a game if you make yourself available. Those of you who are afraid it will result in a commitment to play week-in, week-out, never fear:

The team is picked based on who makes themselves available at the start of each week. However, if you are not pre-registered as part of the squad, you simply can't be picked.

Are you a paid-up Club Member ?

If you have paid your annual subscriptions, don't read this.

If you have not paid your annual subs, hurry up and join the Club. This can be done easily, once you've made contact with the Club. Simply pay the subs to the Club's bank account via bank transfer, or give the subs to a Club Committee member and ask him to make the transfer to the Club account. New BCF rules ... or are they ?

In order to ensure clarity over the scoring and to avoid arguments that have marred matches in previous seasons, the BCF has introduced a new form to be filled in after every delivery in this year's league. The batsman will need to declare, in triplicate on a signed and dated light green form in English, French, Dutch, Urdu, and Gujerati – how many runs he scored. This will need to be countersigned by the bowler, the umpire and two fielders. One copy will be given to each captain and one to each umpire.

When a wicket falls, all players on the pitch, as well as all spectators, will need to sign a sworn (beige) affidavit in the presence of a "juge d'instruction".

Captains and umpires will be issued with a hole punch and ring binders, to be stored at square leg. Should the ball strike the binder or hole punch, two runs will be awarded and an extra form (eggshell blue) will need to be filled in by all the above parties certifying what occurred. Any damage to the binders will result in an immediate 50 Euro fine payable within the half hour to the BCF account.

Umpires will be authorised to deduct runs from teams who scribble, do not sign their names properly, use red biros instead of the authorised black or blue or are unable to supply sufficient number of the requisite forms in the right colours.

The BCF has agreed to sub-contract part of the European Commission's archive centre at Zaventem for the storage of forms, which will be destroyed after 200 years. A senior French European Commission official, Mr Pap Erasse, will oversee the system and will be paid 200,000 euros a season, which will necessitate a rise in the BCF subscription to 20,000 euros per team. This position will be ratified by an annual meeting of BCF Committee members held in the Bahamas. Ratification implies a unanimous vote by all committee members able to attend the meeting, so long as they wear the official BCF sweater and loud pink shorts.

Finally, in order to avoid the use of non-registered players, all players will be required to bring to each game their original birth certificate and any living parents and siblings. Umpires will be sent on a one week training course in DNA testing at the Belgian Police College at Eleau-Eleau, so that positive identification can be performed before the match and again at tea time, when all sandwiches will also be tested for nandrolone.

Accompanying the above new administrative arrangements, all League matches will be reduced to five overs.
